About the Saugerties Food Pantry

The major beneficiary of the Merry Go Round Auction

How many times have you heard someone casually say, “I’m starving?” For most of us, eating healthy and nutritious meals has become an inevitable part of life that we simply take for granted. We wake up and eat breakfast, followed by lunch and dinner; and the day’s bounty usually includes at least one snack.

However, for the 38 million “food insecure” Americans, there is no guaranteed next meal. Many of these people are our nation’s most vulnerable, children and senior citizens, but this group also includes lower and middle class working families who are struggling to make ends meet. Five million families across the United States simply cannot afford to buy the food that they need, resulting in at least one family member going hungry.

Although hunger may seem like an abstract term that is limited to far off countries on other continents, it is a very real problem both in our country and in our community. The Saugerties Area Council of Churches recognized this need over thirty years ago and has been providing much needed, nutritious food to numerous families ever since.

The late reverend Frederick Imhoff, who presided over the First Congregational Church in Saugerties, provided the foundation for what is now the Saugerties Area Council of Churches Food Pantry, opening a food closet in the mid 1970’s.

The idea sprung from the distribution of government issued cheese and other items at the First Congregational Church. Imhoff saw the need for the regular distribution of food to the needy, and with help from his wife, Dorothy, opened the Saugerties Food Closet on Partition Street, in the building that now houses Electronic Control Concepts.

When it became apparent that more space was needed to accommodate the growing number of participants, a pantry was opened in the basement of what was, at one time, the parsonage of the Saugerties United Methodist Church, the Head Start building.

The first volunteer coordinators of the pantry were Ethel and LeRoy Donaldson, a retired couple in their late fifties. The Donaldsons, with a small group of volunteers, managed the operation of the pantry for a decade and served more than 100 families each month. After the Donaldsons' stepped down, Marilyn and Paul Richardson took the reins as coordinators. That was 15 years ago, and the Richardsons are still on the job. The pantry eventually relocated to a second location on lower Partition Street. Most recently, in an effort to make the pantry even more accessible to the community, it moved to the current location at 44 Livingston Street.



The hours of operation remain the same today as they have for the past 15 years, with the pantry open two mornings and one evening each week. The participation has almost doubled during the same time period. With a volunteer staff of about 60 the Saugerties food pantry now serves over 240 families, comprising more than 500 people, each month.

In addition to private and business donations, the pantry now relies on monthly donations from each church within the Saugerties Area Council of Churches. Grants are also a regular source of funding the pantry's mission. In addition, the Boy Scouts of America provide thousands of food items to the pantry each November, during their annual Scouting for Food drive, and the yearly Post Office Food Drive helps to keep the shelves stocked each May.

With demand for food at an all time high, as families everywhere fall prey to a failing economy and soaring prices, The Richardsons say that only one thing remains to be changed, the attitudes of those more fortunate members of the community.

While donations of both money and non-perishable food items seem to flow into the pantry more frequently during the colder months, peaking during the holiday season, hungry families can be found throughout the community throughout the year. Cold and hunger do not necessarily go hand in hand. The Richardsons ask that people join with them in thinking of their less fortunate neighbors all year long.

Description: Legend has it that Henry Hudson began carving rocking horses at age 19. When his crew mutinied in 1611, he was put out of the Half Moon along with his son and a rocking horse, never to be seen again. "Henry Hudson Rocking Horse" is painted in iridescent colors, gold leaf and faux wood grain. The metal rockers are bolted to the form.

Artist Bio: A NY native, Kenny Rich graduated from the Ringling School of Art in Sarasota, Florida. After college, he began his career as an airbrush illustrator working for major commercial advertising accounts. After 25 years of illustrating, he now focuses on doing 2D art on 3D objects. Look for his 1951 Chevy denim covered pickup truck called Bluejean Hauler.

Also included are a few insects: a butterfly, ladybug, bee, caterpillar, grasshopper and two other flying bugs for children to find among the plants.

Artist Bio: Mary Boscher grew up in the mid-west, attended the Chicago Art Institute and earned a BFA at the University of Illinois. After moving to New York, she continued her studies at SUNY New Paltz earning a MFA. She has taught art and theater.

Her work has been displayed in many collections and exhibitions including the New York Society of Etchers and the Northeast National Pastel Exhibition at the Adirondack Center for the Arts.
